Online Learning	Teachers will post learning activities for the children on Google Classroom for Years 1-6 and on Tapestry for Year R. Children will be able to hand in their work on the platforms and teachers will provide feedback. This may include videos of the teacher teaching, presentations, worksheets or links to specific online applications such as Oak National Academy. Children also have access to a number of online maths and literacy websites which they have passwords for: Time Table Rockstars, Spelling Shed, Accelerated Reader, Purple Mash and Bug Club (Key stage dependent).

Advice for Parents	Regardless of your child's age, it is important to have a schedule for them during their additional time at home. For extended periods at home, our teachers will provide a weekly timetable to help you spread the learning across the week.
